

Frequently Asked Questions

QHTA State Conference 2018 - Brisbane Girls Grammar School

Time and Date?

Saturday 30 June - 8.00 am – 4.00 pm followed by wine and cheese session

Venue?

Brisbane Girls Grammar School. Refer to map below.

Public Transport?

Unfortunately the free Red bus in the City is not available on weekends. Central Station would require you walk up the hill to Gregory Terrace.

Parking?

Brisbane Girls Grammar School -limited parking available so QHTA is grateful to the Brisbane (Boys) Grammar School for providing parking space.

At the Brisbane Grammar School (boys' school to the left when looking at both schools), conference delegates can use

- the Rear Parking lot at the back of the school (see note below*). Boom-gate will be open from 7am.

If parking behind the Brisbane Grammar School but you have to enter the parking area from College Road http://brisbanegrammar.com/images/stories/AboutGra/bgs_campus_map_2010.pdf Note you cannot turn right across the traffic if you are already in College Road and coming from the city ie heading north. You need to be heading south and turn left off College Road just after the Normanby intersection.

Where to go when I get there?

Light refreshments and registration will be from 8.00 am to 9.00 am served in the trade area on ground floor area of G Block. You need to collect your name tag and a conference bag at the Registration area near the Gehrman Theatre. This is a good time to visit the trade area.

Will there be refreshments?

Coffee, juice and snack will be provided on arrival. Morning tea and lunch will be provided in or near the trade area. You should have noted any special dietary requirements when you registered online. Ask the service staff for your specific dietary food. There will be wine or non alcoholic drinks, cheese platters and prize draw at end of the day in the trade area.

After I register, what is the first session? When will the day end?

At 9.00 am there will be a short introductory session and Welcome to Country in the Gehrman Theatre and this will immediately be followed by the presentation of the Dr Russell Cowie 'Excellence in History Education Award.' Professor Glenda Sluga from the University of Sydney will then present your keynote address.

The Conference ends at 4.00 pm but will be followed by a wine and cheese gathering.

How do I know what workshops to go to?

There are four sets of workshops and you should have registered for these online or by contacting qhta@qhta.com.au if you have any difficulty getting back into your booking. Note that some workshops are fully booked so you need to go to the workshops you have nominated. You should have received a confirmation of the workshops you have chosen as part of the online confirmation. If you have forgotten or do not have the email confirmation, lists of people in each workshop will also be available on the door of each room and in the registration area.

Where will the workshop sessions be held?

There will be a list of the workshops on the Conference Program in your conference satchel. The rooms are noted at the bottom of each workshop description. The numbers on your name tag are the numbers describing your workshops. The room numbers are on the sheet in your satchel.

Will there be a trade area?

Yes – on the ground floor of G block where refreshments will also be served.
