Guess Who #1

- I was born on the island of Mer in the Torres Strait in 1936.
- I grew up in a community deeply connected to the land and its traditions.
- I fought for the recognition of Indigenous land rights in Australia.
- I challenged the concept of terra nullius, which denied Indigenous people ownership of their land.
- I was a plaintiff in the landmark Mabo v Queensland (No 2) case, which led to the recognition of native title in Australian law.
- I am Eddie Mabo.

- I was born in Jeparit, Victoria, Australia, in 1894.
- I studied law at the University of Melbourne before entering politics.
- I served as the Prime Minister of Australia for a total of 18 years, making me the longest-serving Prime Minister in Australian history.
- I played a significant role in shaping Australian politics and policies during the mid-20th century.
- I founded the Liberal Party of Australia and led it to numerous electoral victories.
- I am Robert Menzies.

- I was a prominent Australian suffragist and social reformer.
